



### Rental Vacancy Rates






2019 Vacancy Rate = 1.8%

#### Main Housing & Financial Takeaways



Households of color, especially those lead by a woman without a spouse, are most likely to experience homelessness – exacerbated by COVID

- Households of color are more likely to:
  - be renters.
  - pay a higher percentage of income on housing.
  - be laid off under COVID-19.
  - have experienced poverty recently.



### Rental Property Support Program



- Eligibility Property owners of rental housing who:
  - Document uncollected rent from March 1 to application date
  - Provide tenant attestations of inability to pay rent due to COVID-19.

489 units supported \$1,660,000
